ZOOM WEBINAR

We're using Zoom as our webinar platform for the course. You must REGISTER for the Zoom Webinar – you will receive a unique link via email to attend the Zoom webinar.

During the webinar, all attendees are muted and your video is off. It is very easy to navigate this platform.

IMPORTANT: In order to receive continuing education credit for this session, you MUST be logged in using your assigned link you receive after registering. Once you are "in" the webinar for the day, do not "leave" the webinar. Just remain connected. You can leave at the end of the day, then log back in at the beginning of each day using the same link in your original Zoom invite.
